

ELL Policy Guidelines 2018

Eligibility Criteria for ELL Supplemental Funding (and ALA in the CSF)

For a school district to receive ELL Supplemental Funding from the Ministry for an ELL student in a particular school year, all of the following must be met and documented:

An annual assessment of the student's English (or French in the CSF) language proficiency in all
areas of language development (reading, writing, oral language) has determined that the student
requires (or continues to require) specialized support to successfully access the provincially
prescribed curriculum (see "Assessment and Identification" section of this document).

- 1. Early Primary Speaking (A & B): Grade K-1
- 2. Late Primary Speaking (A & B): Grade 2-3

Reading (no cost)

ELL district informal literacy assessment or a school based
 assessment (e.g. PM Benchmarks)
 This should be in conjunction with the Ministry ELL Standards reading
 matrices as the anchor to determine the reading levels



Writing (no cost)

1. ELL district writing assessment or a school based assessment

Teachers should highlight the errors and provide prescriptive comments on the sample and use the CMGE or Ministry ELL Standards writing matrices.


Student Log in

Step 1: Once you have codes from CMGlobal English and you are ready to assess:

• Add the **entire** website in the bar (not google):

cmglobalenglish.ca/company/sd23

• The page should look like this:

Step 2:

- Add Username and Password.
- The Usernames: SD23-XXXX (4 numbers)




- The passwords are 10 characters of upper and lower case letters and numbers:
 e.g. bsheDf7V5v
- Assessments can be done on a laptop or chrome book.

Student Name

Step 3:

The students (or teacher) will add their first name and last name. (or teacher can pre-sign in students)



Volume

Step 4:

Students must check the volume. Select the arrow.

• If they don't check the volume here, and try to check it on the first listening question, they will lose the question. They only get one try.



Start Quiz

Step 5: Select Start Quiz

- You can have multiple students writing at once.
- There are 4 sections: Grammar, Reading, Listening & Writing
- The sections are timed.
- Once they start, the students need to finish the section within the time frame.
- They can stop in between sections and the assessment is active for 6 hours but it is advisable to do in one sitting.
- If the internet cuts out, close and go back in with same login.
- Students will have 15 minutes for the writing (students must submit before time runs out or they will lose the writing sample)

Components

There are four easily accessible, student friendly English components



Grammar

The first section is a timed, functional grammar assessment, which consists of 40 sentences. Each sentence has a blank space that requires a word or words.



Reading

The second section is a timed, reading comprehension assessment, which consists of 10 reading passages, both fiction and non-fiction, with a range of readability difficulty. Each reading passage has ten blank spaces.



Listening

The third section is a timed, listening comprehension assessment, which consists of 40 short recordings. The student listens to each recording and chooses the best answer from five possible choices.



Writing

The fourth section of the CM Global English assessment asks the student to produce a writing sample that is timed and based on a randomly selected topic.


- Do not refresh.

- Do not open another browser.


Error Messages



- You can search by student name, code, date or school.







CMGE Support Level 1 - Beginner

Goals:

- · To provide ongoing, interactive opportunities to use English
- . To share ideas using listening, speaking, reading and writing
- . To listen and communicate in everyday classroom activities
- To learn English letter names and sounds
- · To develop and expand beginning vocabulary
- · To use simple prepositions
- · To decode familiar and common words
- . To make connections and respond to simple text
- . To make meaningful connections to characters and ideas in a story
- . To use illustrations, words, phrases, sentences to communicate in English
- . To use and value the student's home language

Teaching Strategies:

Teacher modeling of English (listening, speaking, reading, writing)

Support relationship and team building with students

Content and language objectives are clearly discussed, displayed and revisited

Repeat instructions orally and in print

Use gestures to express meaning and speak clearly and slowly

Have students retell instructions in students' own words

Provide for use of home language for understanding

Provide wait time for student responses
